and the glory forever. Amen.**

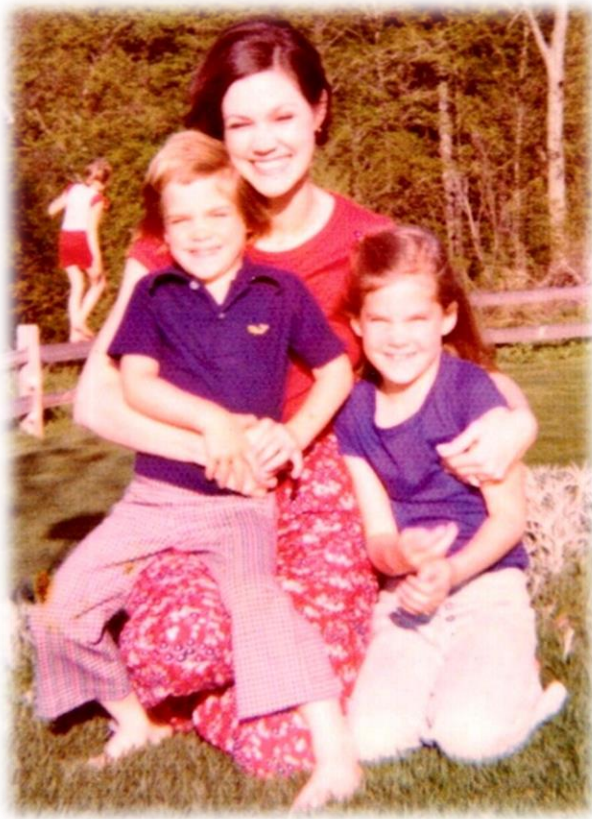
