

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING DECEMBER 22

The Session has called a congregational meeting for **December 22**, immediately following the 11:00 worship service. The purpose of the meeting is the election of a Ruling Elder to complete an unexpired term in the Session class of 2020 and to elect a Trustee for a three year term in the class of 2022. The nominating committee will nominate *Chuck Seidel* for election to the Session and *Tom Anderson* for election as Trustee. Additional nominations are permitted at the meeting with prior consent of those being nominated.



Tom Anderson has been a member of St. Philip since 1993. Originally from northwest Indiana, he has been a local here in Houston since 1989. Tom was a restaurant franchise owner of multiple Subway sandwich stores throughout the Houston area for 18 years, and for the past ten years his career has focused on consulting on strategic business operations and financial planning and securities. Tom has been involved in charities such as the Houston Food Bank and Toys for Tots, and more recently, has participated

Tots, and more recently, has participated with Kids Against Hunger at St. Philip. He is the proud parent of grown son, Jeffery, and grown daughter, Melanie. As a trustee, Tom seeks to be more involved with St. Philip by sharing his talents and years of experience.

Charles (Chuck) Seidel joined St. Philip in 2015 by letter of transfer from First Presbyterian Church, Houston, where he had served as a deacon and ruling elder. In 2017 he was installed as an elder at St. Philip, serving on the Peacemaking and Social Justice Committee. On this committee he was involved in refugee assistance, the community garden, and the Solar Subcommittee of the Property Committee. He is honored to be asked to serve an



additional year and is excited about staying involved in the 2020 Session.

We are quickly moving through what is a particularly short Advent. Our final midweek service of the season is **December 18** at 12 noon with lunch available in the Gathering Area at 12:30. The fourth Sunday of Advent is **December 22**. Our 9:00 service will again take the form of a contemplative eucharist and with opportunities for individual prayers for healing and wholeness. Keatan's sermon for the day is on the Magnificat, Mary's song in Luke 1:46-55.

Undoubtedly, there are also changes ahead that we can't yet anticipate. It's just how life is. DUERR LECTURE SERIES 2020

The speaker for the 23rd annual Duerr Lecture Series, **February 23**, **24**, and **25**, is Rev. Deborah L. Forger, Ph.D., Postdoctoral Scholar, Jewish Studies, Dartmouth College. Dr. Forger holds degrees from Calvin College, Duke University, and University of Michigan, and is an ordained Presbyterian Minister. Most of her academic work and research has focused on the Gospel of John and Second Temple Period Jewish literature. After the Tree-of-Life synagogue massacre last fall, however, she felt compelled to start writing more on the topic of the Bible and antisemitism. Title of the lectures is **"Christian Biblical Interpretation and Christian Antisemitism: Exploring an Unfortunate Link."** Dr. Forger will preach at the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. worship services and present lectures each evening at 7:00 p.m. Lectures are free and open to everyone.




