On Saturday, **February 13,** from 10-noon, we invite you to a drive-thru Mission Day event, collecting toiletries for Easter boxes for The Women's Home. For many years, St. Philip has shown our care and support for women who are rebuilding their lives at The Women's Home with these boxes. They are filled with new toiletries and items the women may need as they get their lives back on track. We hope



to be able to fill 60 boxes this year. Donations of any of the following items are welcome:

Toothpaste (any size)
Dental floss
Cotton washcloth
Lip balm
Facial tissues (small soft-pack)

Small pack of greeting or note cards

Toothbrush (single—not multi-packs)
Bar soap (any size, single bars)
Hand lotion
Nail polish
Pens (black or blue)
Small note pad (3x5 to 5x8)

Instructions for Drive-through: Please enter on the east-side of the sanctuary, drive around toward the Church Office (stopping to pick up your Equal Exchange order along the way and Lent materials for families) and drive around the back side of the Fellowship Hall to the old education rooms (see map). Mission Committee members will be there to accept your donations. Simply stop at our "donation station", and committee members take your donations for The Women's Home out of the seat or back of your car. We ask

everyone participating to please wear your mask and stay in your car. \*Note: if you would like to donate items but cannot participate on Mission Day, you may drop off items at the church office Mondays to Thursdays, 9-4.

As an added bonus, during this drive-through event you are also welcome to drop off gently-used clothing and household items for the *John Blow Clearinghouse*; these will be sorted and distributed to fill needs in our community.

During this unusual year, when gathering for group projects is not advisable, one thing we can do is learn more about the needs of our city and what our mission partners and others are doing to help our neighbors. 

### Dr. Samuel L. Adams

Effective Speech in the Bible and in
Our Age of Polarization



Speaker for the 24th annual Duerr Lecture Series will be Dr. Samuel L. Adams, the Mary Jane and John F. McNair Chair in Biblical Studies at Union Presbyterian Seminary. He holds a Ph.D. from Yale University, a Master of Divinity from the University of Chicago, and a B.A. (History) from Davidson College. He is an ordained Teaching Elder in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and has served churches in Chicago, New Haven, and Richmond.

His publications include a comprehensive study on wisdom literature past and present (with Matthew Goff), recently published, and a book, Wisdom in Transition: Act and Consequence in Second Temple Instructions, examining conceptions of retribution, death, and the afterlife in Jewish instructions. Another research area is wealth and poverty in the biblical world and today. His book, Social and Economic Life in Second Temple Judea, Westminster John Knox, 2014, looks at economic life in the Bible and beyond. Other interests include apocalypticism, the Dead Sea Scrolls, the Bible and film, and the Bible and Christian theology in the context of American political discourse. Adams' background includes a career in politics prior to graduate school and serving as a teacher at a Church of South India college. He is editor of the seminary's journal, *Interpretation*.

The Duerr Lecture Series was established in memory of W. Chris Duerr, member and elder of St. Philip Presbyterian Church, Houston. As part of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and the Reformed Tradition, the lectures focus upon speakers and subjects that will enhance Christian faith in light of that tradition. Challenging speakers are chosen from the fields of theology, Bible and preaching to inspire and equip congregants for deeper faith and service.
