

PINK IFTAR

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Are you a woman interested in interfaith dialogue and in learning more about the traditions of our Muslim sisters? Then mark your calendar for the Pink Iftar, sponsored by the Women's Table of Houston, in participation with Rice University's Boniuk Center for Religious Tolerance and, for the first time, St. Philip. The Peacemaking and Social Justice Committee, supported by the Session, is pleased to invite all St. Philip women to this spiritually inclusive event in the interest of

furthering interfaith education, conversation, understanding, and friendship.

Every Muslim must observe the Ramadan fast from dawn to dusk for a month, and then every day at sunset, break the fast and share a meal (the iftar) with family and friends. Muslims fast for the love and worship of God that awakens their sense of solidarity with the less fortunate and places emphasis on generosity and charity.

The Pink Iftar is the only program of its kind in Houston. Women of Muslim faith backgrounds gather with women from other faith traditions to enjoy an informative talk, followed by a call to prayer, and breaking of the fast with a shared meal. A Muslim conversationalist will head each table of eight and share her life experience and perspective.

The event begins on **Thursday, May 9**, at 7:00 p.m. (registration at 6:30), with a program in the Sanctuary led by Wafa Abdin, Executive Director of Houston Volunteer Lawyers, discussing Islam and women, followed by the meal in the Fellowship Hall.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

In a variety of styles and through a range of emotions, Holy Week and Easter invite us to experience the fullness of the gospel. I urge you to seek the spiritual benefits of these days and these services through your participation in all that is before us.

On **Maundy Thursday**, **April 18**, we worship at 7:00 p.m. We remember Jesus' final night with his disciples and his last meal with them. Keatan is preaching that evening and the St. Philip Choir will sing. After communion, the chancel is stripped of decoration, symbolizing the abandonment of Jesus by his disciples and friends. We leave the sanctuary that night in silence.

On **Good Friday** we have two worship services. At 12 noon we commemorate the death of Jesus with scripture and song and in the presence of the veiled cross. At 8:00 p.m. we are holding a Service of Tenebrae In this dramatic service, shadows slowly gather in the room as we encounter the betrayal, denial, and abandonment that marked Jesus' final days. With each reading, a candle is extinguished. The service concludes in darkness. We are also offering a worship opportunity on **Holy Saturday** at 5:00 p.m. Matthew Dirst and friends lead us in a musical meditation for Holy Week, exploring the depth and power of the Passion through music.


Easter Sunday is **April 21**, and we are continuing the schedule from last year. Hoping to create a little more space for people to be with us that day, we are offering festival services at 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. The services will be identical: the St. Philip Choir will sing at both; I'll preach at both; we'll have communion at both. If your schedule permits, consider attending the 9:00 service to help us balance the crowd with us that morning. Easter breakfast will be available in Fellowship Hall from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m., as well as crafts and activities for children. Again, we'll have a cross outside of the sanctuary for us to decorate. Please bring flowers to add to it.

This joyful day - and the poignant week leading up to it - have much promise. Perhaps you know someone you'd like to invite to join us for worship at St. Philip?

The Duerr Lecture Series Advisory Board announces the speaker for the 2020 series, February 23, 24, and 25, Rev. Deborah L. Forger, Ph.D., scholar of Jewish antiquity and the New Testament with an additional focus in early Jewish-Christian relations. Most of her academic work and research has focused on the Gospel of John and Second Temple Period Jewish literature. After the Tree-of-Life synagogue massacre last fall, however, she felt compelled to start writing more on the topic of the Bible and antisemitism and her lectures will be related to this timely topic.

Dr. Forger completed her Ph.D. in Near Eastern Studies in 2017 and has recently commenced a three-year postdoctoral fellowship (2018-2021) in the Jewish Studies Program at Dartmouth College. She is an ordained minister in the PCUSA.


