PHILIP-EYE



Holy Week is filled with significance for the life of faith and for our community at St. Philip. I invite you - and encourage you - to join us as you are able.

Maundy Thursday service is at 7:00 p.m. The St. Philp Choir will sing. My sermon, "Love Wins," is based on Matthew 26:17-29. The service includes communion and concludes with the symbolic stripping of the church.

On **Good Friday** we have two services. At 12:00 p.m., we solemnly gather to remember the death of Jesus in word and song. At 8:00 p.m., we have a tenebrae service with music from the St. Philip Choir. In this dramatic service, darkness steadily envelops the Sanctuary as we recall Jesus' final moments.

On **Holy Saturday** at 5:00 p.m., we have a musical meditation offered by Matthew Dirst, Cecilia Duarte, and Thomas O'Neill.

With great joy, we gather to celebrate the resurrection on **Easter** morning. We have identical services at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. with music at both from the St. Philip Choir. My sermon, "An Easy Easter?" is based on Matthew 28:1-10. Communion will be celebrated at both services. If your schedule permits, consider joining us for the 9:00 a.m. service to give an extra bit of space for those who will come to the later service. Easter activities at 10:00 a.m. include breakfast and an egg hunt for children. You are welcome to bring flowers to decorate the outdoor cross.





SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES FOR ALL AGES 9:30 a.m. - 10:40 a.m.

GODLY PLAY (Age 3-Kindergarten) – Room 104—Our preschool class uses a curriculum called "Godly Play," developed by Jerome Berryman in Houston, and utilized in reformed churches all over the world. Godly Play encourages children to use the language of Christians and multiple senses to express what they innately know about God.

ELEMENTARY (Grades 1-5) — Room 105

YOUTH (Grades 6-12) — Room 205

Both the Elementary and Youth classes use the PCUSA's new *Follow Me* curriculum. These lessons are based on 36 practices that Jesus engaged in and taught his followers about. Learners will locate these practices in scripture, while engaging in conversation about the practices in their daily lives. With a wide variety of developmentally-aligned activities, conversation starters, and questions to ponder outside of class, this curriculum calls us all to follow Jesus and live out his example every day.

ADULT BIBLE STUDY—Room 204—We are continuing our study of the Kingdoms of Israel and Judah in 2 Kings with the story of Elisha and the fate of Jezebel in Dr. Robert Alter's <u>Ancient Israel</u>, The Former Prophets (2013). Join us from 9:30 a.m. – 10:40 a.m. to deepen our understanding of God's faithfulness to God's people from Dr. Alter's translation and commentary on the Biblical Hebrew. All are welcome.

CHURCH & SOCIETY – Room 201—Church and Society regularly features speakers and presentations on a variety of contemporary and historical matters of faith and practice. This class meets from 9:40 a.m.-10:45 a.m. with presentations in person and some by Zoom, projected in the classroom. SOCIAL JUSTICE STUDY GROUP CONCLUDES 2ND YEAR OF ANTI-RACISM STUDY

This year's book and discussion group, sponsored by the Peacemaking/Social Justice Committee, has completed a 2nd year of exploration of racism in America. *Good White Racist*, by Kerry Connelly, was our most recent review. The group met by zoom, 1st Tuesday nights of the month, 7-8 p.m. This recent study afforded us the opportunity to learn a lot – about our country's often racist policies and laws, about social customs past and present, about ourselves. The role of the church in social and racial injustices was not overlooked.

What's next? We will take a brief break, but future studies are not ruled out. We fifteen or so participants agreed that we want to continue to learn, to remain informed about racial and other injustices, and to highlight those issues to our church community. St. Philip has been beacon over the years in areas of social justice and advocacy. This current study gave us reason to hope that individually and as a community we will continue to seek repentance and experience hope.
