MISSION

DID YOU KNOW: St. Philip provides one way for us to live into Jesus' commands to "Love one another as I have loved you," and "do justice and love kindness." Over the years, our Mission Committee has identified local (primarily) as well as national and international organizations worthy of our support. Today, St. Philip has 32 Mission Partners (MPs) who benefit from small grants made from the Mission budget—usually \$100,000 from our annual pledges (although requests




for support exceed that amount twice to three times over). God's resources, both human and monetary, shepherded by St. Philip, are well spent in partnership with organizations like these that are dedicated to reaching out and helping, teaching, serving and uplifting those in our local and global community who are in dire need. As Bill Stubbs so beautifully expressed on Sunday, May 21, service on the Mission Committee is both meaningful and exhilarating! Bill highlighted Liberty High School located in one of Houston's poorest communities. Liberty is the only high school in Texas where newly arrived, over-age, immigrant students can go to school while working full-time and taking care of family responsibilities. The Mission budget provides \$50 gift cards to graduating seniors. Last year, the Valedictorian of Liberty received a "full ride" scholarship to Brown University, but did not have the resources to buy the things she needed to go (e.g., computer, dorm room necessities, etc.). The Mission budget for Liberty had already been depleted, but the Mission committee took on the project and raised the funds needed to start the young woman off on the right foot. St. Philip is a generous community!

Thanks be to God for St. Philip's Mission program.
