DID YOU KNOW: PC(USA) believes: The church's educational mission is to help us discern the will of God in order to do it in the world. Knowledge should be directed to values. "If I . . . understand all mysteries and all knowledge, . . . but do not have love, I am nothing," wrote Paul (1 Corinthians 13:2).



Presbyterians have a long and proud history of recognizing the importance of education. There are currently over 45 universities in the US directly affiliated with the Pres-

byterian church, and many more with deep Presbyterian roots. The first PC(USA) seminaries were founded in 1794 and 1812. Today there are 12 notable Presbyterian seminaries. Our three highly intelligent pastors studied Greek and Hebrew at Presbyterian seminaries in order to help us better understand the Bible as originally written.

The Education Committee here at St. Philip is charged with continuing the church's support of learning and enlightenment. Its responsibilities include: lining up teachers (and often serving as teachers) for Sunday School classes for toddlers through adults, and facilitating Vacation Bible School, the Summer Lecture Series, Second Sundays inter-generational activities such as the Blessing of the Animals (can you believe two cats attended and behaved), and the Organ tour, among other events. Committee members also create and re-stock the children's activity bags available to families during worship services.

When we baptize a baby here at St. Philip, Keatan walks up and down the center aisle holding the baby, and explains to the baby that we will tell him or her the story of Jesus. We want to do the very best job of telling the story of God's love for ALL of us, telling the story of Jesus' time with us here on Earth, and telling the story of how our lives are transformed by what we've learned.

INTERNATIONAL SEAFARERS

The Mission Committee is making plans to collect items for Seafarer's Christmas Boxes. Bins will be available in the Gathering Area each Sunday during the month of October for your donations.

Ship crew sizes average 22 Seafarers to gift per ship. In 2022, the Seafarer's Christmas Gift program received and distributed 9,173 gifts on-board 403 ships which represented Seafarers from more than 61 different countries! These gifts had been donated to the Seafarers by over 179 churches, organizations and individuals! The Christmas shoeboxes are personally carried to each ship by HISC Staff, Port Chaplains, and Ship Visitors – *Your* Staff of Chaplains and Ship Visitors, as the ecumenical ministry is funded by all denominations. They begin delivering boxes after Thanksgiving and continue gifting Seafarers until all the gifts have been distributed! Chaplains are gratefully prepared to receive the gift boxes that we pack and wrap.

News of these boxes reaches far and wide with great anticipation. Sailors from all over the world hope to be in port in Houston during the Christmas season to receive the famed Christmas Boxes. One such Captain was so excited with his box, that he video taped himself opening his box while talking to his family online. His daughter was so moved by the gift, that she started a campaign to give Christmas Boxes to underprivileged people in their hometown in Ukraine.

SECURING HEALTHY CHILDHOODS

As we move further into our 120th ministry year I am reflecting on Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services' (PCHAS) growth and adaption in securing healthy childhoods. With deep appreciation for our St. Philip partner over the last eighteen years, I would like to share how the organization has recently evolved to meet community needs.

As many are aware youth are struggling with threats to their health and well-being according to the 2023 report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). To address this issue and be closer to the families we serve, PCHAS has recently relocated its Houston office to a more residential area of the city that is filled with schools and homes. The reconfigured space provides room for play therapy for small children and support groups for teens and tweens. It also includes a large training room for the almost daily classes being conducted to educate foster families on trauma that is often present with children in the child welfare system, to prepare adoptee parents to welcome children into their families, as well as offering continuing education to strengthen our staff skills.

Our Counseling Center at PCHAS provides services to individuals, couples and families, and children and adolescents in-person or virtually through teletherapy. With children we address anxiety, depression, bullying, divorce, ADHD, grief and loss, relationship and social skills, in addition to executive functioning skills. Fees are accepted from several private insurers or self-pay. We are continuing to strive to add additional payment panels to increase accessibility.

Our counselors provide strength-based clinical support to individuals and families. The PCHAS Philosophy of Care is to meet clients where they are and to focus on treatment goals that lead them to a path of growth and healing. Adults and children develop a more positive outlook on life and gain hope for a brighter future with guidance from a trusted, unbiased resource. Our work is Christ-centered in that we work compassionately and not in judgement of our clients.

These enhancements are in addition to our communitybased programs that serve children and families including Single Parent Family, Child and Family, and Foster Care & Adoption.
