CLERK OF SESSION

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS AUGUST 2018

Stated Session Meeting - August 21, 2018

- ♦ Session approved the transfer of membership letter of Katie Senor Hannan to Atascocita Presbyterian Church, Atascocita, TX.
- † Session endorsed the mission statement of More Light Presbyterians, thus beginning the process of St. Philip becoming a More Light church.
- **†** Session approved the addition of a statement of responsibility to the Personnel section of the Manual of Operations concerning recognition of employment milestones.

Committee Actions:

- Personnel Committee hosted a celebration of Keatan King's fifth anniversary of service at St. Philip on Sunday, August 5, 2018.
- † Property Committee charged \$263,000 of expenses to Reserve for Replacement for the first half of 2018, leaving a July 31 balance in the Reserve for Replacement fund of \$681,000; down from \$871,000 at the beginning of the year.
- † Finance Committee recommended to the Trustees that they consider consolidating the Funds that currently reside with Texas Presbyterian Foundation (TPF) and the Presbyterian Foundation (NCMF) into TPF, alone.
- † Mission Committee has decided that for December, Joy Gift envelopes will be made available in the pews. The December Communion Offerings will go to CCSC Capital Campaign.
- † Mission Committee has approved for the 2019 Budget, that the amount of benevolence dollars pledged (excluding Presbytery of New Covenant) be a tithe of 10% of the Operating budget.
- \$\Phi\text{Mission Committee has approved for the 2019 Budget, that the amount pledged to Presbytery of New Covenant be \$55,000.
