



MUSIC NOTES

Organ music — Today’s organ **voluntaries** are both based on American hymn tunes. To date, William Bolcom has written some twelve “gospel preludes” for organ. His prelude on “Amazing Grace” is an extended set of variations, ranging from campy New Orleans-style jazz to Bachian counterpoint. This beloved tune, devised in 1835 by American composer William Walker as a shape-note melody, has long been married to a text from an Anglican clergyman, whose spiritual conversion in 1748 marked the end of his slave trading activities. The British pianist and composer George Shearing left several volumes of organ works, including a set of variations on the early American hymn tune “I Know That My Redeemer Lives.” The harmonies of its final variation especially, heard at the close of today’s service, evoke his standard jazz idiom.

Vocal music — This morning’s **anthem** is an arrangement of the 19th-century American folk tune SHOUT ON by Austin Lovelace, who served for 52 years as Minister of Music at Willshire Presbyterian Church in Denver, Colorado. Once considered the “dean of American church music,” Lovelace composed over 800 works for organ, choir and solo voice, and he served on the editorial committees of several denominational hymnals. Written in 1983, today’s **communion anthem** is a well-known setting of verses from Psalm 34 reflecting the black gospel tradition by American composer James E. Moore, Jr., who is also a pianist and conductor. Born in LaCrosse, Virginia, the composer has lived since 1984 in Vienna, Austria, where he serves as a professional coach and teaches voice and conducting.







This lively text was written for the 90th anniversary of St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. Echoing Psalm 98, it is a prime example of a 20th-century hymn style based on phrases rather than complete sentences. The exuberant tune was created expressly for these words.

The second line of the first stanza shows that this hymn is meant for use in the context of the Lord's Supper, but the last stanza further clarifies its special purpose as a sending hymn celebrating the values guiding the work of the church in the world: service, courage, mercy.
