



ABOUT TODAY'S 11:00 A.M. MUSIC

Organ music — Sebastian Bach's *Prelude in G Major*, BWV 541/1, is one of his most exuberant essays. Today's **opening voluntary**, combines the toccata figuration of the North German *stylus phantasticus* with the rhythmic drive of a Vivaldian ritornello, all in the service of Bach's relentless creativity. The **closing voluntary** comes from Bach's most sumptuous collection of chorale preludes: the so-called "organ mass," published in 1739. It is the third part of his *Clavier-Übung* ("Keyboard Exercise") series. "Wir glauben all' an einen Gott" is Luther's paraphrase of the Latin Credo, a universal statement of belief.

Choral and vocal music — This morning's anthem by C. Alexander Peloquin was composed in January 1972, and uses a simple choral refrain in English as bookends on either side of a central verse in Latin. The verse comes from the well-known chant hymn Ubi caritas, here set over a dreamy, gentle organ accompaniment. Peloquin was organist and director of music at the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul in Providence, RI from 1950 until his retirement in 1991. • Today's solo was arranged in the early 1950s by the great American composer Aaron Copland as one of the selections in his two sets of *Old American Songs*. Copland sets Robert Lowry's famous American hymn HANSON PLACE in a distinctly new "Coplandesque" style, heard in the setting's unique accompaniment.
