## WORSHIP NOTES

The 11:00 procession includes the “return of the Alleluia.” Following the custom in which the word “Alleluia” is neither spoken nor sung during the season of Lent, the children buried an Alleluia banner in the garden six weeks ago at the beginning of Lent. The banner was uncovered earlier this Easter morning and Alleluias ring out through our service today in celebration of the resurrection.

Communion is served by intinction. Come forward via the central aisle, receive the bread and dip it into the grape juice. The station closest to the windows has individual cups of grape juice. All the bread served is gluten-free. Persons with difficulty coming forward may receive communion in their seats by signaling the servers. Everyone is welcome to receive communion today.

During the final hymn, gifts for the One Great Hour of Sharing may be brought forward. This annual offering supports Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and the Self-Development of People.
