📕 MUSIC NOTES

Organ music — During his early 20s, François Couperin wrote two collections of organ music to be used in the traditional French liturgical services of the period, the organ alternating in dialogue with sung chant throughout the liturgy. His *Messe pour les Paroisses* was composed for use in regular parish churches, and his *Messe pour les Couvents* (which we hear selections from this morning) was written for use in monastic convents or abbey churches. These short organ pieces would have been preceded or followed by equally brief Gregorian chants, in a practice called *alternatim*, with chanters singing a verse, and the organ playing another (without singers) in alternation back and forth until reaching the end of that particular part of the liturgy (the Kyrie, or Gloria, for example). Our **opening voluntary** this morning features two of the organ pieces from the Kyrie of Couperin's Convent Mass, and the **closing voluntary** comes from the same collection's Agnus Dei.

Choral music — This morning's **anthem** uses words from the 14th chapter of the Gospel of John in a setting by British composer Philip Stopford, who currently serves as director of music at Christ Church (Episcopal) in Bronxville, NY. *In My Father's House* was commissioned for the choir of St. Petronille Parish in Glen Ellyn, IL, and was premiered on the 90th anniversary of the parish on April 19, 2015. Like much of Stopford's music, the anthem is written in a very accessible and affective style, both for the choir and for listeners. • Today's **offertory** is by British composer Philip Wilby, who is Professor Emeritus in the School of Music at the University of Leeds.
