December 2021

Stated Session Meeting - December 21, 2021

- Session approved the Celebration the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at the Presbyterian Women's Retreat on Sunday, January 25, 2022, off campus at the Journey Retreat Center.
- Session accepted Ralph and Ralph, P.C.'s report of its independent audit of the St. Philip Presbyterian Church financial statements for the years ended 2020 and 2019.
- Session approved the following Communion Offerings for 2022: Seafarers Ministry in January; Interfaith Ministries Meals on Wheels in February; Living Waters for the World in March.
- Session approved the securing of \$7,200 for six months of rent for an Afghan refugee family to be identified by Interfaith Ministries of Greater Houston (IMGH) as part of their refugee resettlement program.
- Session confirmed the hiring of Kenya Thomas as our bookkeeper, effective December 13, 2021.
