MONDAYS IN ADVENT—LECTIO DIVINA ON ZOOM—December 11, 18 at 9:00-9:20 a.m.—What is Lectio

Divina? The ancient desert fathers and mothers believed that scripture was like a love letter written to us by God. Thus, the meditative, guided scriptural reflection known as *Lectio Divina* ("divine reading") assumes that God speaks to us intimately, God is already praying in us, and we'll experience a profound encounter with the heart of God, rather than an intellectual study of scripture. Keatan King will guide the group through the four cycles of Lectio (read, reflect, respond, rest) for 20 minutes every Monday morning at 9:00 a.m. for the season of Advent. To prepare, you are encouraged to choose a comfortable place to sit wherever you are (at home, work, in the car) and all participants will have video off and sound off during the Zoom. Guillermo del Toro returns to the real-life history of its original story, rooted in Italian fascism between the World Wars. Del Toro, well known for his exploration of how our theology is reflected in our relationships, also has much to say about life, death, resurrection, human identity, and the relationship between fathers and sons.
