APRIL 2024 ST. PHILIP VOLUNTEER ACTIVITY WITH **MISSION PARTNER** PLANT-IT-FORWARD—St. Philip members are invited to volunteer with mission partner Plant-It Forward's farmers on Saturday, April 13 at 10595 Fondren Rd., Houston, TX 77096 -9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Volunteers will help farmers with weeding and mulching. Please bring water and wear hats, long sleeves and pants, sunscreen, and close-toed shoes. Plant It Forward empowers refugees to develop sustainable farming businesses and produce fresh, healthy food for our community. Plant It Forward also collaborates with the Houston Food Bank and in 2023, they provided 1,800 servings of fresh produce to more than 100 families. Plant It Forward was able to launch the Land Access Initiative in 2023, connecting new farmers with value-aligned landowners to increase the number of family-owned farms in the Houston region. St. Philip mission grants have supported three program areas of Enterprise/Food Hub, Urban Farming, and Farmer Education since 2018. Also, St. Philip grant funding helped farmers with their water bills during the 2023 summer drought, paid for infrastructure improvements on the farms by installing cold storage units which doubled farmers' weekly sales capacity, and the installation of four on-farm wash & pack structures that improved food safety and working conditions.

OPERATION IMPACT DELIVERY MISSION PARTNER CHURCH WIDE SERVICE DAY—

SAVE THE DATE! Join the St. Philip mission partner Interfaith Ministries for their Operation IMpact event to deliver hurricane supply boxes and bottled water cases to the Meals on Wheels seniors at their homes. Save the dates of Saturday, June 1 and Saturday, June 8. St. Philip mission committee and church members will meet at the church to divide the hurricane supply boxes and water, then drive in teams of 2 or 3 in each car to the addresses Interfaith Ministries provides. If you are not traveling to Mo-Ranch for the retreat the weekend of June 1, this is a great service opportunity you can participate in benefiting the homebound seniors in our community. June 1 distribution will be in Harris County and June 8 distribution will be in Galveston County mainland, not on the island. Sign up will begin in April. AMAZING PLACE is pleased to let everyone know that the expansion "west" is proceeding. The groundbreaking was in Q3 of 2023. The second week of March the foundational forms were being concreted. The storm sewer/ flood detention dry pond is in place. In addition, the Central Campus on Drexel just completed the 2023 volunteer analysis. WOW! Volunteer hours was up over 50% from 2022. This does not quite get us recovered to pre-COVID numbers but we are getting there. And expansion and continued COVID relaxation continues to bring more clients back and newer clients to be served.
