PHILIP-EYE

On Sunday, May 2, Keatan King and the Presbyterian Women of St. Philip recognized three members as Honorary Life Members of Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). They were recognized for their commitment to Christ and the mission of the church. They included Mickey Meyers, Cathy Patterson, and Mary Ann Thomas.



Reflecting on the contributions of Mickey Meyers, Keatan said, "Mickey's singular commitment to Christian Education and



faith formation of this congregation is unparalleled. Her creativity, innovation, and deeply held belief that God is still transforming

our minds is a gift to us all. Mickey is a natural mentor and has taken it upon herself to guide and affirm children and youth. To receive an encouraging word from Mickey is like the feeling of God's own embrace, and disciples of all ages are grateful for that encouragement."

Of Cathy Patterson, Keatan shared, "Cathy's leadership set a tone and trajectory for us all when the congregations of Central and St. Philip merged. Her voice, wisdom, and actual words are etched into many of the documents that guide us, whether the purpose of CMEF or the St. Philip mission statement itself. These words have staying power because they're rooted in Cathy's trust in God's word,



and the promise it holds for all of us. There's not an ounce of produce that has come from our community garden in the past seven years which hasn't been tended by Cathy somewhere along the way from seed to shelf at CCSC."



In recognition of Mary Ann Thomas, Keatan said, "Mary Ann served with distinction in the role of Moderator of Presbyterian Women. Over the course of several years, when asked to serve a little longer or take on just one more project or plan a new thing in a new way, Mary Ann said yes—always with a servant's willing spirit and joyful heart. With no fanfare, I watched her quietly reach out to women in

this congregation who were particularly vulnerable, struggling, or isolated to bring them into loving community and to be Christ's hands and feet to them. She represents St. Philip well in the larger PW leadership at the Presbytery level with her characteristic generosity, and Thursdays in the office haven't been the

same without Mary Ann at the front desk this year."

Honorary Life Memberships are rooted in a tradition that began in 1912. It is a select group who has been so honored over several generations. The contribution made in their honor will support training women for future leadership in the church.

The Honorary Life Membership pin's design was adopted in celebration of the coming together of Presbyterian Women from the former United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and the Presbyterian Church (U.S.).


HORIZON BOOKS


