The school is a mission initiative on our campus benefitting families lacking access to quality early childhood education. Everyone learned about this new chapter in St. Philip's service to our community.

OPERATION IMPACT delivers hurricane kits to hundreds of homebound Houstonians-On June 1 and June 8, Julie MacLemore Wells and Sid Wells and Angelina Fonseca-Grewal joined hundreds of Houstonians who picked up medium sized boxes of hurricane kids filled with canned food and dry non-perishable food. Sid and Julie delivered meal to eighteen people, and Angelina delivered to 5 people across Houston and Galveston counties to deliver the boxes to home bound citizens. Meals on Wheels for Greater Houston believes in preparation for Hurrican Season. To prepare our seniors and not require Interfaith Ministries staff or volunteers to be on the roadwavs when conditions are not safe, we deliver these hurricane meal boxes each year. Meals on Wheels for Greater Houston was able to deliver hurricane meal boxes on Saturday, June 1st to over 800 Meals on Wheels seniors in Houston. With 5 meals per box, that totals over 4,000 emergency meals now in the hands of our older, homebound neighbors. Our seniors need our help all year round - not only during Hurricane Season.
